


Around the world, the number of girls and boys missing out on an education because of armed conflicts, forced displacement, climate-induced disasters and other protracted crises is increasing drastically.

Disruption to education has an enormous effect on children and adolescents in crises. Children who are out of school are at much higher risks of abuse, exploitation, forced recruitment by armed groups, child labor, child marriage, gender-based violence and more. Education offers protection, empowerment and hope to those left furthest behind in crises.



In spite of education being recognized as the foundation for all other human rights and a necessity for development, education has traditionally not been prioritized in humanitarian responses. The importance of collective action has never been greater, nor more urgent. This is why Education Cannot Wait was created.

ABOUT EDUCATION CANNOT WAIT

Education Cannot Wait (ECW) is the global fund for education in emer-gencies and protracted crises within the United Nations. [Note: While hosted by UNICEF, ECW is a unique, multilateral dedicated Fund and operations are run by ECW's own independent govern-ance structure.]

Where does ECW work?

ECW funds are invested in countries affected by emergencies and protracted crises – including armed conflicts, forced displacement, climate-induced disasters and epidemics. To date, ECW has invested in 46 crisis contexts around the world.

Who does ECW reach?

ECW investments aim to <u>reach</u> those left furthest behind in crises – including refugee, internally displaced and other crisis-affected children and adolescents, as well as teachers/school administrators, and other crisis-impacted groups and communities.

ECW'S MISSION

ECW works to generate greater shared political, operational and financial commitment to meet the educational needs of millions of children and youth affected by crises – with a focus on more agile, connected and faster response that spans the humanitarian-development-peace continuum to lay the ground for sustainable education systems.


ECW'S VISION
